



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LORIN MILLER, Director



In his tenth year as Artistic/Musical Director of the Placer Pops Chorale, Lorin Miller brings a distinguished background as a solo performer, music educator and choral director. In addition to his work with the Chorale, Lorin serves as Executive Musical Director and co-founder of "A Gift of the Heart," a Placer County performing arts organization benefiting local charities. He currently serves on the voice faculty of William Jessup University, as well as Musical Director for Auburn Grace Community Church. A California native, Lorin

grew up in Grass Valley, where he developed a deep love of music. He holds an undergraduate degree and a master's degree in Humanities, with a music performance concentration. After graduation, he produced, recorded and toured with a solo album before pursuing film scoring at UCLA. Following his successful career in Hollywood television production, Lorin returned to this area and to his love of music. Lorin has performed nationally and internationally, throughout Europe and Asia, in a variety of styles from Bach to Broadway. This extensive solo career has most recently included European tours with the Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra to Vienna, Prague, Budapest and Munich in the summer of 2004, and with the "A Gift of the Heart" outreach program to Slovenia each fall from 2009 through 2013. Lorin has performed as a tenor soloist with the Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra. He led the Placer Pops Chorale on a fourcity singing tour of Ireland in July of 2012. He is currently preparing the Chorale for its second singing tour, traveling to Barcelona in July of 2014.

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NELLA FANTASIA (In My Fantasy)

"Nella Fantasia" ("In My Fantasy") is a song sung in Italian based on the theme "Gabriel's Oboe" from the film The Mission (1986). With music by famed composer Ennio Morricone and lyrics by Chiara Ferraù, "Nella Fantasia" is popular among classical crossover singers.

"Nella Fantasia" first appeared on Sarah Brightman's album Eden (1998). A music video for the song was released on Brightman's "Diva - The video collection DVD" in 2006 and the song sold 2 million digital copies in South Korea. On the March 1999 video recording of her "One Night in Eden" concert, when introducing the song, she said:

"My next song was originally an instrumental written by the composer Ennio Morricone for the film The Mission. About three years ago I wrote to Mr. Morricone, asking whether he would give me permission to turn this particular piece into a song. He flatly refused. So every two months I would send yet another begging letter, until I think he became so sick of me that he finally relented. And I am really glad that he did, because I think it works beautifully as a song."

WHO WE ARE

The Placer Pops Chorale, led by Artistic/Musical Director Lorin Miller, is an auditioned choral group of 75 singers that performs with its own orchestra. The Chorale puts on two major concert series each year, in May and in December, along with special appearances and benefit performances, including the annual, free "A Gift of the Heart" Homeland concert celebrating the 4th of July. Taken largely from the American tradition, the Chorale's music represents a variety of styles, with a strong emphasis on the popular music of the last 75 years, including the best of Broadway and Hollywood. The group is diverse in nature, and has participants of all ages. Under the inspired leadership of Director Miller, the reputation of the Chorale has soared in recent years, attracting talented singers to the group, and drawing music lovers to its dynamic concerts - often sold out weeks in advance.

A FEW REMINDERS


Pagers and mobile phones: The audience is asked to turn paging devices and cellular phones OFF or to a NO SOUND setting upon entering the theatre.

appropriate time.



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
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OSHER LIFELONG LEARNING INSTITUTE

WEST SIDE STORY

Music by Leonard Bernstein Lyrics By Stephen Sondheim Arranged by Mac Huff

This music comes from the movie "West Side Story" which transplants the classic tale of "Romeo and Juliet" to New York City in the 1950s. The movie, starring Natalie Wood and Tony Breymer, premiered in 1961 and immediately became a 'must see' for everyone. The original story focuses on two feuding families and is replaced by brawling street gangs. The Montagues become the Anglo Jets, led by Riff, and the Capulets become the Puerto Rican Sharks, led by Bernardo. At a dance, Tony, former leader of the Jets and Riff's best friend, and Maria, Bernardo's little sister, see each other across the room and it's love at first sight. With opposition from both sides, they meet secretly and their love grows deeper. However, the gangs are plotting one last rumble, a fight that will finally end the battle for control of the streets. Will Tony and Maria's love carry through a battle that threatens to destroy the people they love around them?

The arrangement of music in this Choral Suite features a medley of songs in which you will feel the energy and tension between the two rival gangs as well as the bond of love between Maria and Tony. You will be able to follow the attraction of the two main characters and their epic journey to try to be together while struggling to remain true to their respective gangs. This is truly a heart-wrenching story with many levels of physical and emotional conflict.
