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

The Making of Holiday Concerts 2015

It is mid-September and the SMC singers are gathering at the Seventh-day Adventist Church for their first rehearsal of the new cycle. Dressed in shorts and tee-shirts, we have all the sanctuary doors propped open for ventilation, but we are soon singing Holiday music and trying to imagine "Christmas trees and boughs of holly".

The preparation for these concerts began long before our first rehearsal. Last spring, our director Ken Hardin did his usual masterful job of selecting the musical program. In May we received the music from our librarian, Vicki Cambron, so we had all summer to get familiar with it. During

the fall, Ken and Cathy Collings (orchestra manager) selected and hired all the members of the orchestra who add such a rich and full dimension of sound to our choral concerts. Meanwhile, we singers were using our practice CDs, regular weekly rehearsals, sectional and extra rehearsals, plus an all day workshop to learn the music and improve our vocal technique.

Our success in reaching this goal is due in large part to Ken, who inspires us to work hard to master the notes and rhythms, so we can then pay more attention to his directing and "make music" together. Translations and notes

Magnificat

Magnificat anima mea Dominum My soul doth magnify the Lord



Come, Colours Rise (A South African Christmas Anthem)

Dedicated to Desmond Tutu; Archbishop of Cape Town. The work was composed partly in response to the many Christmas carols sung in South Africa mentioning snow, which many South Africans have never seen. The inspiration for Come, Colours Rise was Archbishop Desmond Tutu's reference to South Africa as the "Rainbow Nation." The rainbow and other images refer both to the natural beauty stirring African pride and love for their country, and the beauty of their people's different shades of coloring.

The refrain is sung in English and Xhosa, a South African language related to Zulu:

Come Colours Rise Under African Skies Yizani zintlanga vukani Phantsi kwezulu le Africa

The -zulu within the second line means sky. The Zulu call themselves people of the sky. Christ has come uYesu ufikile

The verses using a few African words:

Verse with male voices:

From tabled altar, steepled **krans** (Afrikaans word for a cliff) In **khaya** (Xhosa and Zulu word for a traditional African hut/home) or where campfires dance. From fruited valley, field field of wheat In hut or city, let drums beat.

Verse with female voices:

We thank you might God on high For mountains sea and radiant sky For rivers, **veldt** (*Dutch and Afrikaans word for open grassland*), and fertile earth But most of all for sacred birth.

About Ken Hardin - Conductor/Artistic Director

Ken Hardin received his degree in vocal performance from CSU Northridge along with extensive training in choral and instrumental conducting. He studied conducting under composer, conductor, pianist and arranger Jay Blackton, best known for his work as music director and conductor for Rodgers and Hammerstein. Hardin also studied both conducting and piano-stylings with the noted composer and arranger Johnny Green. He directed, composed, and accompanied musicals and played for auditions throughout Los Angeles, and was the pianist for honor choirs with celebrated choral conductors such as Los Angeles Master Chorale's Paul Salumonovich and Roger Wagner.



Since moving to Nevada County in 1984, Hardin has served as the conductor of the Sierra College Nevada County Campus Choir, Music in the Mountains Chorale, and currently the Sierra Master Chorale. In addition to conducting, Hardin is the artistic director of InConcert Sierra, a noted pianist (jazz, classical and Broadway), and serves on a variety of local boards and committees.

"I think I was able to use experience and on-site training along with conservatory training as a way to become a better conductor. My best training came from working with and watching some of the best choral conductors in the world. I have had a wonderful career as a pianist, conductor and artistic director, and having the opportunity to be the music director for the Sierra Master Chorale continues to be an absolute joy."

About the Artists

Conor Jamison (bass-baritone) began singing in the Nevada Union Choir. He was a member of the Chamber Choir, Regional and All-State honor choirs, and two Europe Choirs. He was a scholarship singer at Chapman University, San Jose State University, and at Humboldt State University where he acquired a BA in music in 2009. Opera Roles include: Dr. Bartolo from Le nozze di Figaro, Snug The Joine, from Britten's A Midsummer Night's Dream, Aeneas in Purcell's Dido and Aeneas, and Uberto in Pergolesi's La serva padrona. He has studied privately with Dorla Menmuir, Dr. Peter Atherton, Dr. David Rohrbaugh, and Dr. Elizabeth Harrington. Professionally, he has performed section-leader and soloist duties for many different choirs throughout the state, including a performance of Faure's Requiem with the Sierra Master Chorale under the direction of Ken Hardin in 2010. In 2013, Conor received his Masters in Musicology from San Diego State University.

Robert Rossmann (Narrator) Most recently seen as Max Bialystock in The Producers and Vanya in Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike, Robert in Proof, Oberon in A Midsummer Nights Dream, Willy Loman in Death of a Salesman and as Psuedolus in A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, produced by Sierra Stages. Richard Altenbach, concertmaster, received his Master of Music Degree from University of Illinois where he graduated magna cum laude. Formerly first violinist of the Los Angeles Chamber, LA Opera, Joffrey Ballet, and Houston Symphony Orchestras, he has also served as Concertmaster of the Mozart Camerata, Associate Concertmaster of the Omaha, Berkeley, and Hollywood Bowl Orchestras, and a member of the Fontenelle String Quartet. Richard performs currently as Concertmaster of Auburn Symphony and InConcert Sierra. He has been featured locally as a chamber musician and as soloist for InConcert Sierra, Music in the Mountains, and the Apollo Arts Ensemble.

For over 25 years, Altenbach has been a sought-after Hollywood Recording Musician – participating in over 1000 film scores. An A-List Violinist, and Principal for Danny Elfman, Richard has participated in over 1000 film scores with such composers as John Williams, Hans Zimmer, James Horner, Howard Shore, James Newton Howard, and the two late greats Jerry Goldsmith and John Barry. He is also an award-winning composer. Richard, his musician/singer wife Dawn, and their very musical young son Bren, reside in Nevada County.
